

# Report from the Scheme manager

2019/2020 will inevitably be remembered for the events of the last 3 months of the year with the arrival of the Covid-19 virus and the need to adapt our ways of working to meet the challenges it raised. However, over the year the changes made in key areas enabled us to respond well when needed to during the unfolding pandemic. This is most clearly illustrated by 3 significant developments which have ensured that as we move into 2020/21, we remain active and continue to provide support to vulnerable families across the Borough.

As briefly mentioned at the end of last year our IT systems were failing and this precipitated a decision to upgrade our systems to Microsoft 365. We started using a cloud based system for all of our common files and we now have an intranet fit for the 21st century, that all can access from home or office which has enabled us to continue our work during "lockdown". Alongside this we made the decision, funded by our lottery grant to move across to Charity Log for our case management as HSUK are phasing out the MESH system. Training for the move began in October and by January we were ready to start transferring data to the new system. We are still getting used to the way Charity Log functions and working out how to make it work best for us – but we are getting more confident and over time we will stop missing MESH! The final step of the transformation process will be to go paperless, but this is unlikely to happen until 2021/22, giving us time to get used to charity log before taking the final step.

In June last year, HSUK announced they were planning a review of the Preparation Course for volunteers. I was invited to join the working group necessitating a couple of trips to Leicester, which was invaluable in terms of meeting managers from other Home-Starts and hearing how they run their schemes and train their volunteers. The aim of the work was to update the training and make it more relevant and to develop new materials that are easier to deliver. The training materials are now PowerPoint based with new scenarios, and have been cut from 32 essential hours of training to 24 hours, which means a 6 week rather than an 8-week course. As a member of the working group we were able to receive the materials ahead of publication and were therefore using them for our course that began in February and was suspended in mid-March. Having these materials will enable us to complete the course remotely in the coming months. Generally, the updated course has been well received, and allows us flexibility to make sure our training is relevant for our situation here in Wokingham. In December 2019, Amy joined us as our Fundraiser. We have already seen an increase in our social media profile and we now have a new fundraising strategy.

This was developed ahead of the current emergency situation and therefore may need to be reviewed, but we now have a pathway to assist us in strengthening our fundraising going forwards. In the meantime, the raising of our social profile is key for families to know we exist and can support them. Over recent years we have seen an increase in self referrals, and we want to be able to continue to offer support directly to families that do not have contact with statutory services. Raising our profile will also help us to attract volunteers moving forwards. With a new website due to be launched mid-year, we aim to continue to make families, referrers, partner organisations and potential volunteers aware of our service.

Alongside these 3 key changes to our ways of working the team has continued to support families across the borough. Our Tools for Life Project run by Teresa, has gone from strength to strength with its Brambles Chat and Play group having a clear impact on the lives of children and parents. A second group, in partnership with the Children's Centres and Early Years team was just beginning when the emergency situation took over, so this will be a priority in the coming year. Home-visiting support remains the core work of the charity, and what makes us different from other organisations across the Borough. This year we have continued to provide support to families through our amazing team of volunteers backed by our coordinators, Mandy and Lindsay and with Elaine keeping us all organised!

As we move into our 25th year we need to continue to innovate, to enable us to widen our funding base and ensure we remain relevant, providing a service that is available and responsive to the needs of families. Over the coming year we will continue to work hard to identify the needs of families and how best we can respond to them.

Finally, I want to say a huge 'thank you' to the team for all your hard work, the trustees for your ongoing support and all of our wonderful volunteers. Without you, there would be no Home-Start Wokingham.


## Where our supported families live

# Annual Financial Report 2019/2020

# Our sincere thanks go to all those who have supported us during the year.

The summary of Home-Start Wokingham District (HSWD) accounts for the year ending 31 March 2020 are set out below and they represent the day to day operations of the scheme. They have been independently examined by Mr Tim Kingcott ACMA ATT.

#### **Financial Status**

HSWD received its funding during the year from a variety of sources but in the main from The Big Lottery Fund and from other national/local organisations and trusts. We received the second year's funding (4 year project) of £39,789 from The Big Lottery relating to Tools for Life, £24,000 from Wokingham Borough Council, and £5,000 from Wokingham United Charities.

In addition we had deferred income of £7,500 from Garfield Weston, £2,000 from Comic Relief, £2,000 from Kiriath Trust and £1,200 from the Woodward Trust. The Scheme also received a large number of smaller donations that each made a valuable contribution towards our income total of £103,421. Our expenditure was £129,606 resulting in a net deficit of £25,422. Our net assets excluding pension liability total £59,422.

From a financial point of view this was more challenging than the previous year. In the short term the organization is able to withstand a financial deficit in its funds because of careful monitoring of expenditure in the past. Ideally the trustees would like a breakeven situation year by year. Whilst our short term funding maybe secure the trustees will continue to monitor its resources on a regular basis and make difficult decisions if necessary to ensure the long term viability of the scheme.

#### **The Contingency Fund (Reserves)**

The Charity holds £34,000 in reserve within the general fund and is designed to help finance any situation that the scheme may find itself in at

short notice. Closure would result in employment redundancy compensation being payable as well as employer debt on withdrawal from the pension scheme. The Charity aims to maintain the reserves in line with guidance from the Charity Commission on an ongoing basis. We review our reserves' fund on an annual basis.

#### The Future

Fortunately the Scheme's short term future is secure for the next year or two. In addition to the organisations listed above we have deferred income from Wokingham United Charities. At the end of February, Amy our staff fundraiser secured £10,000 funding at their Strictly Charity event. Recently the newly elected Mayor chose Home-Start as one of his charities for the coming year. These are major endorsements of the work of HSWD. The trustees very much appreciate all these contributions which secure the short term future of the Scheme. We believe we offer tremendous value for money to local families who rely on our professional help so much and that we make a major contribution to our local community. Unfortunately the demand for our services is increasing and we are unable to cope within our existing resources.

Due to Covid-19 we believe our services will be more in demand and the issues becoming more complex. We are committed to continuing our vital work in the community for as long as possible.
